#### SUPPLEMENTARY SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Organising Authority is Quoile Yacht Club. These Supplementary Sailing Instructions (SSIs) are in addition to the Notice of Race (NoR) and General Sailing Instructions (GSIs), also available at <a href="https://www.strangfordloughregattas.co.uk">www.strangfordloughregattas.co.uk</a>. RRS 63.7 is changed so that in the event of a conflict between the NoR or GSIs and these SSIs, the SSIs shall prevail.

Where 3 or more IRC registered boats compete in Race 1, they will automatically be placed in separate IRC classes and will not receive a YTC result.

#### 2 Changes to the Sailing Instructions

- 2.1 Any changes to the sailing instructions will be posted in the QYC clubhouse before 1030hrs on the day they will take effect and may be announced on VHF Channel 37, at least 30 minutes before the start of the first race.
- 2.2 Any change to the scheduled time of any first warning signal will be posted by 2000hrs on the day before it will take effect.

#### 3 Courses (Classes 1 to 12)

- 3.1 Courses will be displayed on boards on the committee boat. The appropriate course board for each class is specified above.
- 3.2 Marks on a red background are to be left to port.
- 3.3 Marks on a green background are to be left to starboard.
- 3.4 Letters on a black background indicate the number of laps to be sailed.

#### 4 Racing Marks (Classes 1 to 12)

4.1 Appendix A shows the approximate positions of marks in the racing area.

#### 5 Hazards and obstructions

- 5.1 All boats must pass north of Marks K and R and to the seaward side of marks 2 & 6 unless they are the next mark of the course.
- 5.2 All rock marks may or may not be in place and competitors should make themselves familiar with the position of pladdies and rocks.

#### 6 The start (Classes 1 to 12)

- 6.1 The starting line shall be between a red and white pole on the committee boat and Mark No.7.
- 6.2 All yachts shall keep clear of other classes in the starting area between their preparatory signal and start.

#### 7 The finish (Classes 1 to 12)

7.1 The finishing line shall be between a red and white pole on the committee boat and Mark No. 7.

#### 8 Shortened course (Classes 1 to 12)

8.1 The Race Committee may shorten a course by attaching a second buoy marked S to any mark of the course. Yachts should return to the finish from that mark.

#### 9 Time limit

9.1 Any yacht failing to finish by 17.00 will be deemed to have retired and be scored as DNF.

#### 10 Estuary Course (Classes 13-14 inclusive)

10.1 Will be a triangular course in Lindsay's bay, starting and finishing at the QYC Workboat which will be located approximately 1/3 of the way up the beat. Starting sequence will be 5, 4, 1, Go (RRS 26). All classes will sail 3 laps, unless shortened.

### 11 Safety

- 11.1 Safety boats are requested to liaise with the Safety Officer prior to the commencement of racing at or before 13:00.
- 11.2 Safety boats are requested to assist with ferrying before and after racing.
- 11.3 Crews should be familiar with RYA and class safety regulations.


